Student Illness Policy

If your child is sick or showing signs of infection, please do not send your child to AAC Camp and let us know as soon as possible. In order prevent the spread of illness to staff and other students, your child must stay home if they are not feeling well enough to actively participate in the camp day and/or if your child are experiencing the following:

- Temperature of 100 degrees F
- Diarrhea (more than two abnormally loose stools in a 24-hour period)
- Vomiting
- Redness of the eyes, discharge, or matted lids (suggesting conjunctivitis)
- Untreated spots and/or rashes
- Signs of head lice or other parasitic infections

Please take note that students must remain “symptom free” for 24 hours before attending camp again. A doctor’s note stating that the student is not contagious, has been prescribed medication, or otherwise clearing them to attend camp will also suffice.

It is the parent/guardian’s responsibility to communicate honestly and directly with Tate staff on the state of their child’s health, and of any known occurrence of infectious
